<i>Outline the Remit proposal that you are putting forward.</i>	<b>Measuring – M</b> Remove the need for horses over 168cm in height to have their shoes removed for a RAS Life Certificate measure.
CURRENT RULE(s)	
<i>Rule(s) number(s) and wording of current rule(s) this remit seeks to change.</i>	<b>M</b> <b>M7 – Life Measures</b> d) Applicants requiring a RAS Life Measure must have the Horse's/Pony's shoes removed and the hooves trimmed.
PROPOSED NEW RULE(s)	
<i>Rule(s) number(s) and wording of new proposed rule(s).</i>	<b>M</b> <b>M7 – Life Measures</b> d) Applicants requiring a RAS Life Measure must have the Horse's/Pony's shoes removed and the hooves trimmed, <b>except when the horse has attained the height of 168cm or higher.</b>
RATIONALE	
<i>Outline the reason for the remit – eg "the current rules states 3 days. Our proposal states 2. The proposal reduces the waiting period by 1 day. Also note any circumstances or events which may have prompted this remit.</i>	The horse/pony's shoes have to be removed to achieve the greatest accuracy when measuring for a Life Certificate; but once a horse attains 168cm or more in height (see Rule M7 a), the finite accuracy is not required. They become eligible for a Life Certificate regardless of age.  It therefore becomes an unnecessary extra cost to the owner of a horse over 168cm when measuring for a Life Certificate.
