<i>Outline the Remit proposal that you are putting forward.</i>	<p><b>Measuring - M</b></p> <p>That we remove the anomaly between Rule M8 h) – “Horses/Ponies 3 years of age and under are deemed “Youngstock” and are not eligible for Annual Measures”;</p> <p>and Rule M9 a) “.....Youngstock Measures issued to a pony or Miniature horse under the age of three years after 1<sup>st</sup> August will.....</p>
